Will I get enough eggs?

At Cofertility, we exclusively work under the egg sharing model. Rather than cash compensation, our donors keep half of the eggs retrieved and donate the other half to your family. We believe this model benefits everyone involved, particularly the donor-conceived child.

Since launching, we've worked with many hopeful dads on their path to parenthood. In some cases, there's interest in making embryos with one sperm source; in others, there may be two partners who both want to contribute sperm to create embryos. In the cases of two sperm sources, you may be particularly cognizant about the number of eggs you can expect to retrieve in a cycle.

How many eggs can I expect from one cycle?

The number of eggs retrieved varies by patient and cycle, but can be predicted by a donor's age, AMH, and antral follicle count, all of which will be known to you after the donor's initial screening. If, for any reason, the donor's results predict that she won't retrieve a sufficient number of eggs to do a split cycle, we will re-match you with another donor at no additional Cofertility Coordination Fee.

While every case is unique, for those who match with a donor in our fresh egg donation program, the average number of mature eggs a family receives is 12*.

*Note: this number is updated periodically based on cycle outcomes.

More options

We have hundreds of available donors, each as unique as the intended parents they match with. They represent more than 55 ethnicities, and over 40% have a graduate degree or higher.



Ethical and human-centered

With cash compensation eliminated from the process, donors are less likely to donate to multiple families. This limits the number of potential biological siblings your future child may have.

Exploring the option of completing two cycles

Even with these success rates, you may want to explore doing two cycles. Without cash compensation, two cycles with Cofertility is likely to be less expensive than one cycle with a donor receiving cash compensation.

If you're interested in doing two cycles with the same donor, it can take a few forms:

1

You and the donor agree to complete two cycles upfront

You and the donor discuss two cycles, but wait to see the outcomes from the first cycle

Depending on the donor's ovarian reserve, you may retrieve enough eggs in the first cycle to eliminate the need for a second cycle. We will talk through the possibility of a second cycle with your donor ahead of the first cycle, but it doesn't need to be noted in the legal agreement.

We encourage you to talk these options through with your physician so that you can make a decision that considers your family building goals alongside factors the donor's ovarian reserve, age, and other fertility-related factors. We designed our Split program to be mutually beneficial and are excited to work with you to achieve the best possible outcomes for your family.
